

# College Level Examination Program (CLEP)

## Students engaged in the CLEP Program:

- Save time and money by advancing through college coursework more quickly
- Focus on degree specific courses
- Perform extremely well in subsequent college-level courses.

**“The College Level Examination Program (CLEP) allows students to demonstrate that they have acquired college-level mastery of course content.”**

## Eligibility:

Any student may take a CLEP exam, but statistics indicate that chances of passing are diminished if ACT individual score is lower than 23. Double credit may not be received by taking the course in addition to passing the CLEP test. CLEP credit will only be granted in areas where coursework has not been taken.

## Deadline:

All CLEP exam scores must be sent to North Central within the initial 65 credits of a student’s program to be accepted toward degree requirements.

## What to Expect:

CLEP exams are 90 minutes long and are administered on computer. Student receive instant score reports following completion of the exam. With the exception of Freshman College Composition with Essay, the exams are composed of primarily multiple-choice questions. The Freshman College Composition with Essay exam consists of a 45 minute multiple choice section and a 45 minute essay section.
