Hello! We are so excited to welcome you to North Central!! Here are some tips for registering:

- The first 2 classes on your schedule should be ENG 124 - Rhetoric \& Research and either BIBL 126 Old Testament History \& Literature or BIBL 127 - New Testament History \& Literature. These classes are prerequisites for many other classes.
- Full-Time Status is considered 12-18 credits, which coincides with Block Pricing tuition.
- Online Courses are designated with a "W" after the number in the course code (i.e. BIBL 127.W01) Students may enroll in a maximum of 6 online credits per semester, however, online courses are not recommended for freshmen.
- Provisionally Admitted Students are required to enroll in GS 142 or 143 Strategies for Success and ENG 124 - Rhetoric and Research. Additionally, you are limited to 15 credits and unable to take any online courses for two semesters. To register for your classes, please contact the Registrar's Office at 612.343.4409.
- Music Majors: To schedule a time for the Theory Placement exam, contact the College of Fine Arts at 612.343.4701 or finearts@ northcentral.edu. Students scoring less than a 32 on the Theory Placement exam must enroll in MUS 111 - Fundamentals of Music in the Spring semester. Also, after you have enrolled in the Generic Music Lessons, you will need to contact the College of Fine Arts to set up your lesson times and instructors.

Before you begin: Each 4-year degree offered at NCU has three concentrations, and your first semester should include 1-2 classes from each of these three categories: General Education Core, Christian Studies Core, and your Major Specific Core. General Education courses which the majority of students should take are designated in bold font. Transfer students may have completed these already, and if so can skip them. Classes are 3 credits unless otherwise noted.
