## CLEP Examinations

Credit granting scores are determined by the American Council on Education (ACE) in conjunction with NCU'S Transfer Credit Committee.

## Eligibility:

Any student may take a CLEP exam, but statistics indicate that chances of passing are diminished if ACT individual score is lower than 23.
Double credit will not be awarded by taking the course in addition to passing the CLEP test.
CLEP credit will only be granted in areas where coursework has not been taken.

## Deadline:

AP, CLEP, IB, and DSST scores must be received prior to degree conferral, but it is recommended that students send official scores as soon as possible to be reviewed for program applicability. Credits cannot be counted toward degree requirements until official scores are received by the Registrar's Office.

## What to Expect:

CLEP exams are 90 minutes long and are composed of multiple-choice questions. Some exams include an essay section. An instant score report is received by the student following completion of the exam

## Transferability:

A minimum score of 50 or higher is required for most exams, while some exams require a higher minimum score. Exam and minimum score requirements are listed on the second page of this guide. The amount of credit granted for each CLEP exam is determined by the equivalent course at NCU. A maximum of 30 credits will be accepted for transfer from CLEP, AP, IB, Dantes/DSST and Advanced Standing combined.
